# True Worship is "in spirit" AND "in truth"

Balanced Christianity is comprised of worshipful seeking and careful obeying.

"In spirit" – True worship is when our spirit meets with His Spirit and honors Him.

"In truth": When our spirit meets His truth and follows it.

Part of growing is continually developing both wings of Worship and the Word.
